International Collaborative Human Resources Development Program in Asia to Foster Inclusive Minds

April 27, 2023

1. BACKGROUNDS AND PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

To solve common social issues in the world, it is necessary to collaborate with diverse human resources with different backgrounds and attributes, regardless of nationality, language, religion, gender, or disability. And the practice of Diversity and Inclusion in society is required to realize the basic principle of the SDGs, "Leave No One Behind."

With this background, we launched a new program titled "International Collaborative Human Resources Development Program in Asia to Foster Inclusive Minds" in AY 2021 and have been implementing with the Campus Asia consortium universities in China, Korea, Thailand and Indonesia since then.

After the basic online course: "Cultivating a Caring and Inclusive Society for All"in AY2021, we successfully did short term course from HU to partner universities, Summer School in Hiroshima, and exchange program for one semester from and to Hiroshima University in AY2022 to foster an inclusive mindset. These programs have contributed to the practice of Diversity and Inclusion for the realization of the better society and the SDGs in Asia.

To pursue and accomplish this purpose in the Campus Asia program further, Hiroshima University is planning to do the Summer School program again in AY 2023 and offers students from the Consortium Universities to interact, communicate and learn at Hiroshima University.

Hiroshima University welcomes students from the member universities, who are eager to learn and interact actively with other Asian students in August 2023.

2. EXPECTED PARTICIPANTS

This Summer School is designed for highly motivated students from Campus ASIA consortium universities. Students who are willing to challenge this intensive, academic and cultural program are expected. We also welcome students:

-who are interested in cross-cultural understanding,

-who want to improve their English language skills,

-who are thinking about studying abroad,

-who are interested in diversity and inclusion, and

-who want to work for an international organization in the future.

3. 6 COMPETENCIES TO BE ACQUIRED

-basic knowledge of Diversity and Inclusion -basic knowledge of cross-culture -empathy -communication skills -leadership in teambuilding -cooperativeness in teambuilding

4. THE PROGRAM

The Summer School program features:

(1) Lectures and workshops with academic experts and guest speakers in Japan;

(2) Interactive seminars that encourage stimulating discussion and learning;

(3) An integrated cultural program that introduces a unique side of Hiroshima and includes scheduled cultural activities

(1) Number of students expected from member universities Six students from China -Beijin Normal University (3) -Chungchun University (3) Six students from Korea -Hankuk University of Foreign Studies (6) Three students from Thailand -Kasetsart University (3) Three students from Indonesia -Universitas Pendidikan Indonesia (3) Six students from Japan -Hiroshima University (6)

(2) Application Requirements

1 Students enrolled as an undergraduate student at Campus Asia Consortium partner Universities

*Those who participated in the "Cultivating a Caring and Inclusive Society for All" program are prioritized to be selected.

② Students have 680 or more in TOEIC L&R or similar level of English.
③ Those who are willing to participate in discussions in English.
*The selected students are required to bring their own PC.

(3) Fees for Program Participation

- ① Program fee: free
- ② International airfare, transportation from arriving airport to Higashihiroshima: Ask your university
- ③ Accommodation: reservation by HU, payment by individual

④ Meals and personal expenses: payment by individual
*The participants will receive 80,000JPY from JASSO if their scholarship application is approved by JASSO.
*GPA Requirements: 2.3 or more in a 3-point scale.

(5) Credit and Certificate

A Certificate will be given to participants by Hiroshima University after completing the course. *Member universities will admit this certificate as credit as their

discretion.

(6) Application

Each partner university office is requested to send students' application forms to Hiroshima University <u>by May 22, 2023.</u> *Each partner university needs to set an earlier date.
